Teacher, former POW publish survival story

Former Wausau resident **Julie (Oldenburg) Phend** recently published with co-author **Stanley Edwards Jr.** "D-Day & Beyond: A True Story of Escape and POW Survival." It is a true account of Edwards' World War II experiences and his struggles to survive in enemy territory and in prison camps.

We're told Phend, who teaches English at Lincoln Junior High in Naperville, Ill., first came to know Edwards, a C47 pilot with the 82nd Airborne Division, when Edwards spoke to Phend's students about his World War II experiences.

Phend, who is a Wausau East High School grad, is the daughter of **Ralph and Mary Oldenburg** of Wausau. She and her husband, **Jack**, have two grown children.

magazine. Zopel's story, "Trapped inside my body," is about Zopel's December 1999 car crash in Portage and her struggle to overcome the brain injury she received in the crash.

"I was trembling but appeared uninjured ... a police officer asked if I wanted to get checked out at the hospital, but I told him I was fine," Zopel told *Glamour* magazine. "... But as time went on, I started to feel anything but

healthy. ... When I woke up the next day, I couldn't move. I remember opening my eyes. I was lying on the living room couch, and my mother was standing over me, begging me to tell

her what was wrong. I wanted to scream for help, but I couldn't. I wanted to cry, but I couldn't remember how to. I wanted to point to my head, which felt like it might burst, but I couldn't move my arms. I'd never been so scared in all my life."

Allison's mother **Sherry Zopel** tells us that five years after the crash, Allison, 25, of Portland, Ore., continues on her road to recovery. But she's now able to drive short distances and has returned to work part time.

And she's singing again. Local residents might recall that Allison comes from the musically-inclined **Paul and Sherry Zopel** family. She cut her first CD, "Music From Within," recently.
